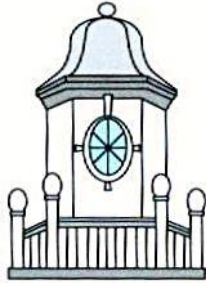

- ✓ Specific philanthropic involvement.
- ✓ Posthumous nominees are eligible indefinitely.
- ✓ Other criteria which may be brought before the Board from internal or external sources.

Anderson served as a dentist in the U.S. Navy, a Clinical Assistant Professor at The Ohio State University, Oral and Maxillofacial surgeon and recently is serving on the Boards of several insurance companies and nonprofits. He has received numerous awards and has been published. He has made eight trips to Central America providing surgical care as well as drilling for water wells there and in Africa. Most recently, he has trained in emergency response in storm-ravaged areas after natural disasters to provide relief. He is dedicated to the benefit of others and was honored for this with the Marvin Fisk Humanitarian Award for local, national and

Professor Emeritus at Lewis and Clark Community College in Godfrey, Illinois, Patrick created 13 new courses in Biology, many of which were the first to use the internet. Dr. Dailey began his teaching career at West Junior High School in Warren. He is the recipient of numerous awards, among them being the Schidel Foundation Scholarship, Presidential Scholar-Electron Microscopy Society of America, Council on Interinstitutional Cooperation Migrant, the J. Neil Admire Faculty Excellence Award and the Emerson Electric Excellence in Teaching Award. He is an outstanding illustrator of insect and animal life, identifying 457 species in etymology, many of which are displayed at

several art galleries, as well as a member of a select group of vocalists who have performed at Carnegie Hall. Dr. Dailey is a 1967 graduate of Warren Western Reserve High School, the first class to graduate from that building

Warren, Ohio

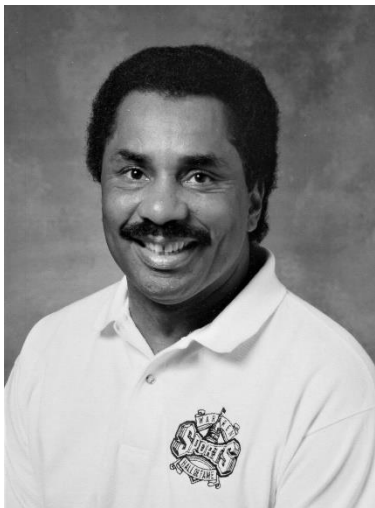


Mary is the Executive Director of Teen Straight Talk, a 501c nonprofit organization committed to educate Truth in the Warren Community. Her agenda has remained steadfastly focused on our local youth but she has also extended her efforts beyond to other communities in other states as well as internationally, speaking to over 500,000 students. Mary's goals remain to address the problems of sexual promiscuity, sexually transmitted diseases and teen pregnancy in the Mahoning Valley and overseas. She has been recognized with the Professional Women of Trumbull County Award, The Women of Courage Award from Kappa Alpha Sorority, Youngstown chapter, Trumbull County African American Achievers Association, and one of four nominees selected for the Hope Foundation Lifetime Achievement Award. She previously was a Cosmetology teacher at

Warren G. Harding High School. Mary graduated from WGH in 1954.

LIONEL C. HARDING-THOMAS, PH.D.

Dr. Harding-Thomas overcame academic obstacles in his early life on the path to receiving an M.A. and Ph.D at Washington State University and he never forgot how he was able to rise above them and achieve not only personal success but to also influence the lives of so many of his students. He became a beacon of hope with a heart of gold and a role model to all of his students, especially those who had been underserved--this became his passion. He served for many years as Counselor and Minority Affairs Director in the Spokane school system and Spokane Community College, establishing a private counseling practice and served in the Silver Valley area of Idaho as a school counselor, therapist, childrens' advocate and teacher. Dr. Harding-Thomas was instrumental in advocating for the initiation of programs in American Minority Studies while a student at WSU. He was inducted into the Warren Sports Hall of Fame in 1991 for his athletic prowess while at Warren G. Harding High School, graduating in 1967, and in college.

MAUREEN MCGEOUGH

Maureen McGeough graduated from Warren G. Harding High School in 1981. She received a degree in Criminal Justice from Ashland University in 1985. Maureen joined the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Diplomatic Security as a Special Agent in 1997. Diplomatic Security Service is the law enforcement arm of the U.S. Department of State and is responsible for providing a safe and secure environment for the conduct of foreign policy. Upon entering the Foreign Service, Maureen was assigned to the Washington, D.C. Field Office where she worked on the protective detail of the U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations. Maureen's Overseas postings include Erbil, Iraq; Copenhagen, Denmark; Kabul, Afghanistan; Lilongwe, Malawi; Capetown, South Africa; and Moscow, Russia. 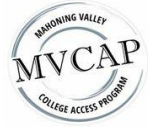
Jarod Zillinger

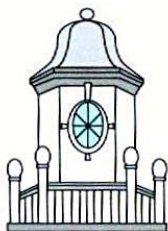
