<u>What happens if a student does not reach College</u> <u>Readiness Standards on the ACT/SAT?</u>

- 1) ACT: 17 COMPOSITE
 - a. Reading: 22
 - **b. Math: 22**
 - c. English: 18
- 2) If you attain the composite & one of the readiness standards—you will enter the appeals process.
- 3) To enter the appeals process, a student must have a 3.0 cumulative GPA at the time of admissions (February 2018) and a recommendation from Mrs. Kampf-Melillo.
- 4) Students will then have to take placement tests determined by the university to meet the course requirements.
- 5) There are deadlines for placement testing. Information is typically dispersed by the university by way of student university email to communicate the process.
